Indiana Immunization Coalition Launches Inaugural National HPV Conference to Advance Prevention Efforts Across the U.S.

Indianapolis, IN — The Indiana Immunization Coalition (IIC) is proud to announce the inaugural **National HPV Conference (NHPVC)** on April 15–17, 2025, at the Hyatt Regency in Indianapolis. This landmark event will bring together more than 400 HPV champions from across the country to accelerate the national response to HPV-related diseases and cancers.

The conference will serve as a vital forum for sharing best practices, fostering partnerships, and promoting innovative strategies in HPV prevention, research, and treatment. By uniting healthcare professionals, researchers, public health leaders, and advocates, NHPVC aims to build momentum toward eliminating HPV-related diseases and cancers in the United States.

Human papillomavirus (HPV) is responsible for nearly 37,800 cancer cases annually in the U.S., including cervical, anal, oropharyngeal, penile, vaginal and vulvar cancers. Despite being preventable, HPV-related diseases remain a significant public health challenge.

“The National HPV Conference is the first of its kind to convene experts and advocates from every corner of the HPV landscape in the U.S.,” said **Sarah Vivo**, Conference Organizer. “This is more than an opportunity to collaborate—it’s a national call to action. Other countries are far ahead of the United States in HPV prevention, with both Australia and Sweden on par to eliminate cervical cancer in the next 5-10 years. We’re bringing together the changemakers who will help us catch up and move forward.”

The three-day conference will feature keynote speakers, panel discussions, workshops, and networking opportunities to advance the shared goal of a future free from HPV-related disease.
