

Indiana Immunization Coalition Statement on the August 10 Executive Order

For more than 50 years, vaccine recommendations in the United States have been guided by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices, an independent panel that evaluates vaccine safety and effectiveness through a transparent, science-based process. This longstanding system has helped ensure that immunization recommendations are grounded in rigorous evidence and informed by the best available science.

The Indiana Immunization Coalition remains committed to evidence-based immunization practices and will continue to follow the American Academy of Pediatrics recommended immunization schedule for children and adolescents.

Preserving a consistent, evidence-driven approach to vaccine guidance is essential to protecting public health. Vaccine policy should remain grounded in science, transparency, and a careful evaluation of vaccine safety and effectiveness.

The Indiana Immunization Coalition will continue to support healthcare professionals, families, and communities with reliable, evidence-based immunization information and practices that help protect Hoosier children and communities from vaccine-preventable diseases.
